What is ClubGRANTS?

- ClubGRANTS is one of Australia's largest grant programs, providing more than \$100 million in cash each year to a variety of worthy causes across NSW.
- Charities, sporting organisations and not-for-profit community groups are among tens-of-thousands of worthy causes funded through the program each year.

2023 Participating Clubs



ClubGRANTS Category 1

Funding will be granted for:

- Specific community welfare and social services
- Community development projects, activities or events
- Health services and employment assistance activities
- Projects aimed at improving the living standards of low income and disadvantaged people
- This ClubGRANTS Committee only funds Community Development projects that will benefit the local Liverpool LGA residents

What is the eligibility Criteria?

- Project must be **community development** focused
- Project must target the **Liverpool LGA local** community
- Project must address at least one of the **local community priorities**
- Organisation must be **incorporated or registered with ACNC**
- All information in the application must be **truthful**

2023 Liverpool Local Community Priorities



What is the eligibility Criteria?

- Project must **NOT be a duplication** of another project or be the core business/duties of the organisation/stakeholder
- Project must **NOT be funded by another funding source** or be the responsibility of another funding source/government department
- Recipients of ClubGRANTS must have submitted their **acquittals**
- Projects can be **auspiced** by another registered organisation

ClubGRANTS Category 2

- Funding for general community development and support projects not specifically listed under category 1
- Activities that relate to a club's core activities e.g. as junior sport and veteran welfare activities
- Category 2 will also fund Community/Cultural events

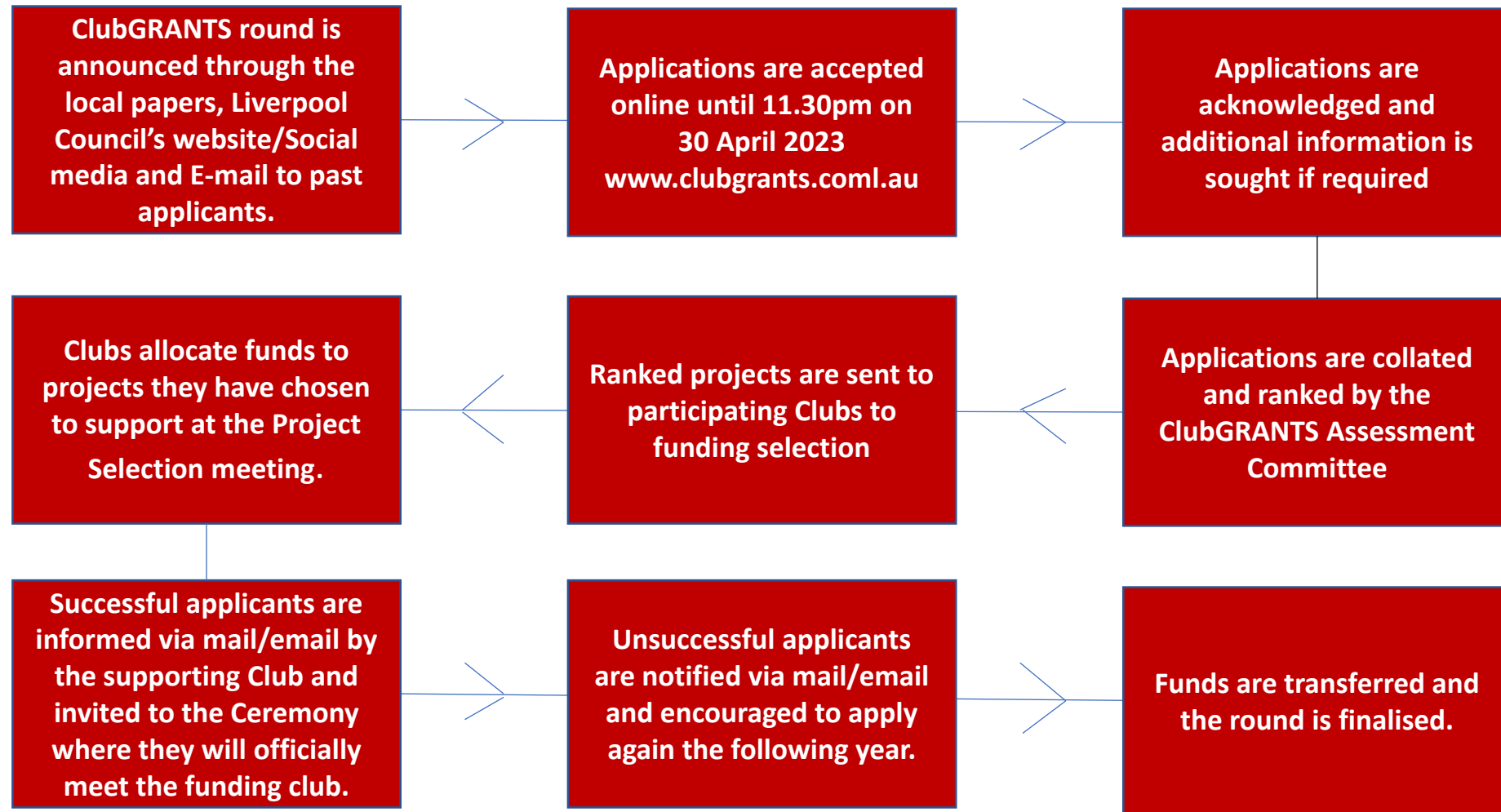
Please note that Council does not administer Category 2 applications, these applications are made directly to the relevant Club and will require Club Board approval

ClubGRANTS Category 3

- A state-wide funding pool that supports the construction of large-scale
- community infrastructure projects such as hospitals and sporting facilities

Please note that Council does not administer Category 3 applications, these applications are made directly to the State Department.

Acquittal Reports

- If you have received any previous club grants you are required to ensure you completed your acquittal process prior to 15 March 2023 to be eligible.

How to apply



- Step 1** Login into www.ClubGRANTS.com.au
- Step 2** Set up your **Organisation's Account**
- Step 3** Search '**Find Your Local Grant Round**'
- Step 4** Apply Online

Helpful Tips:

- Target the identified local priorities
- Demonstrate how your project will benefit/impact the local community and number of people benefitted or impacted
- Use relevant statistics and data to substantiate your claims or issues
- Value for money
- Be creative and innovative with your project

Helpful Tips:

Funding Budget:

- Be reasonable with amount requested
- Itemise all expenditures with clarity
- Income = expenditures
- In-Kind contributions
- Part-funding option if elected
- Salary component is not supported but fees and charges e.g. for consultants, facilitators, service coordination are OK

Helpful Tips:

Things to Avoid:

- Unrealistic budgets –project does not represent value for money
- Heavy administration costs and too little on service delivery
- Spending too much money on equipment items with minimal service provisions
- Project workplan's with unclear or unrealistic objectives – the project lacks clarity and detail
- Projects with recurrent implications – for example a salary component
- Submitting to the wrong category – for example applying for Category 1, however project is eligible under Category 2

Helpful Tips:

Things to Avoid:

- Unrealistic budgets –project does not represent value for money
- Heavy administration costs and too little on service delivery
- Spending too much money on equipment items with minimal service provisions
- Project workplan's with unclear or unrealistic objectives – the project lacks clarity and detail
- Projects with recurrent implications – for example a salary component
- Submitting to the wrong category i.e. apply for Category 1, however project is eligible under Category 2 – please read the guidelines clearly
