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Introduction

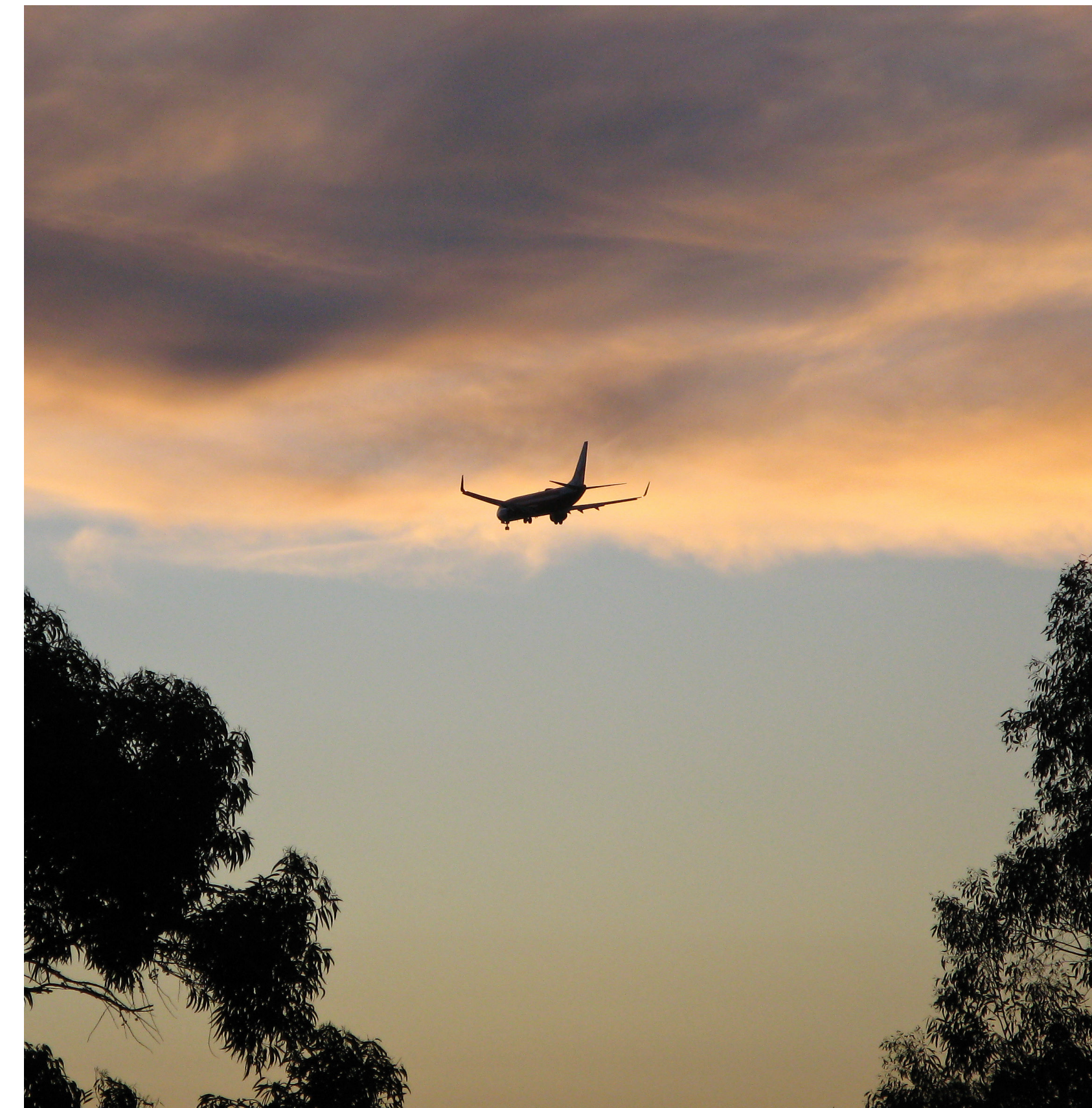
The new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport (WSI) is on track to open in the second half of 2026, bringing employment and business opportunities to the Western Sydney region, and helping to meet Sydney's aviation needs.

Inevitably, the airport will result in some increase in noise in nearby areas. The Australian Government is delivering a Noise Insulation Program, to reduce the impact of aircraft noise inside buildings where people live, learn, or receive essential services.

The program will fund and deliver noise insulation treatments including acoustic insulation and other practical and cost-effective solutions.

We want to ensure as many eligible landowners as possible within the program eligibility area take advantage of the assistance available to them.

WSI Noise Insulation Program now open

The new 24-hour, curfew-free Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport (WSI) will open in the second half of 2026, generating business and employment opportunities for the Western Sydney region.

Inevitably, the airport will result in some increase in noise in nearby areas. The Australian Government’s Noise Insulation Program will provide noise treatments to reduce indoor aircraft noise levels in homes, schools, childcare centres, health and medical facilities and places of worship within the program eligibility area.

The program will run for 3 years, and the application period will remain open for 2 years from commencement.

Noise insulation treatments may include sealing gaps around doors and windows, solidifying external doors, closing vents in walls and ceilings, installing acoustic insulation in ceilings and roofs and upgrading single-glazed windows.

Landowners within the eligibility area will be contacted directly by the department’s managing contractor, Master Building Solutions, who will provide further information and invite them to apply to the program.

Participation in the program is entirely voluntary. There is no cost to eligible landowners for the delivery of agreed noise insulation treatment works.

Eligibility area

The program eligibility area is defined in the Program Guidelines. It is based on the Australian Noise Exposure Concept (ANEC) 20 composite contour for the year 2040, as identified in the [WSI Airspace and flight path design Environmental Impact Statement \(EIS\)](#).

In some areas, including Luddenham Village and Twin Creeks Estate, the eligibility area has been adjusted to account for natural boundaries such as roads, waterways and greenspace.

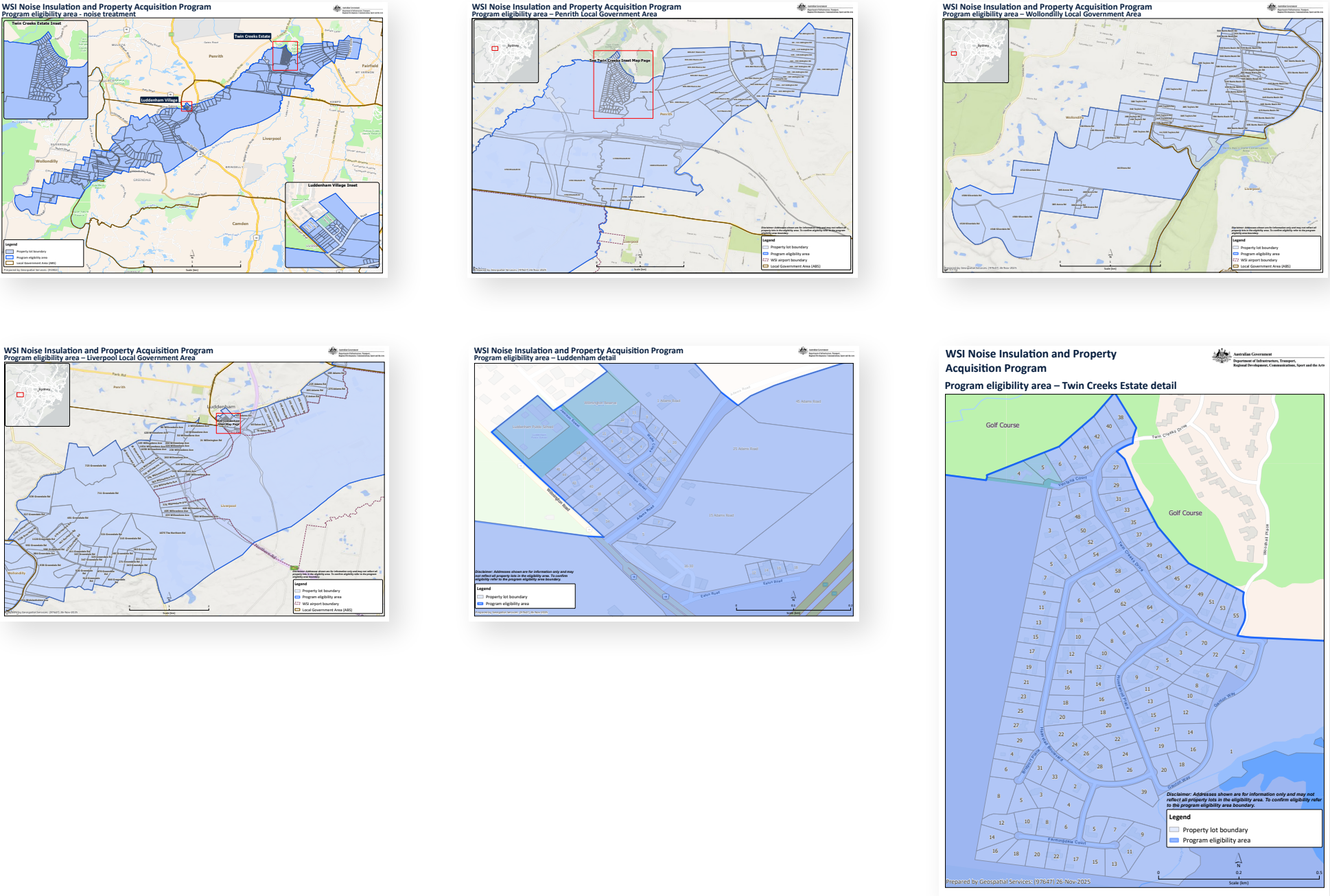
Detailed maps of property lots within the program eligibility area are included below, and a tool to check eligibility is available at wsinoiseinsulation.gov.au.

Landowners and residents outside the program eligibility area are not eligible to apply.

Eligibility to participate in the program is not automatic for all properties within the program eligibility area. Each application will be assessed by the department to determine that the property meets all the eligibility requirements contained in the Program Guidelines.
