WESTERN SYDNEY AIRPORT COMMUNITY UPDATE

WESTERN SYDNEY AEROTROPOLIS SUMMIT



Liverpool City Council's CEO, Kiersten Fishburn, spoke on a panel at the recent Western Sydney Aerotropolis Summit in Sydney. The summit brought together representatives from government, infrastructure developers, investors, aviation leaders and industry experts as they explored the opportunities for growth, identified potential challenges and set the scene for the Aerotropolis landscape of the future.

Liverpool is of equal distance between Kingsford Smith Airport and the proposed Western Sydney Airport at Badgerys Creek. Planned to be twice the size of Kingsford Smith and surrounded by 10,000 hectares of employment lands, Western Sydney Airport offers a unique opportunity for Liverpool and will be a key generator of future jobs. Ms Fishburn highlighted the importance that the vision not only be focused on the airport itself but the surrounding area and its potential to be Sydney's innovation and logistics hub.

It is anticipated that by the early 2030s the airport will generate nearly 9000 direct jobs and about 6900 indirect jobs. Infrastructure development and upgrades will not just benefit airport users but all of Western Sydney, unlocking the economic capacity of the region by easing congestion and cutting travel times. Liverpool City Council is strongly advocating for a rail link to the new airport, via Leppington, as well as a metro extension from Bankstown to Liverpool.

Liverpool City Council's new Women in Business program was launched on International Women's Day, 8 March 2017, at Liverpool City Library.

The event showcased local services for women and included musical, spoken word and dance performances from the Street University and Pepa Molina Flamenco dance company. Attendees were able to participate in workshops on dancing, spoken word, vision boards and henna.

Mayor Wendy Waller launched Council's new Women in Business program which aims to provide a comprehensive service to help local women to **BEGIN**, **BUILD** or **BROADEN** their business. She highlighted previous council initiatives that had supported local women's business ventures, including the Refugee Artist Market at CPAC and Global Sister's *My Big Idea* workshop in Miller.

The Women in Business program will build on these past initiatives and assist women who may face challenges getting started including single mothers and those from culturally diverse backgrounds.

Mayor Waller said "Council is committed to supporting local women on every step of their business journey, from initial concept to expansion. We are proud to encourage entrepreneurship, and have made it a priority to support local jobs for local women."

In conjunction with the South West Sydney Business Enterprise Centre, Council is offering a three month trial program for women to gain training, have mentoring and attend workshops that will help them strengthen their business.


