GRANT FUNDING NOW AVAILABLE

Liverpool City Council has this week launched a grants program to assist local businesses heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to adapt and thrive.

The Business Resilience Grant will help businesses develop or strengthen their online strategy to ensure they can continue to operate during this challenging time and into the future.

This online strategy could involve pivoting your business or operating model, offerings or marketing strategy to connect with new and existing customers.

To be eligible for this grant and to apply for up to \$5000 towards your online strategy by Friday 22 May, businesses must:

- Have fewer than 20 employees (including sole traders) if based in the Liverpool CBD or have fewer than 100 employees if based in other parts of the Liverpool LGA;
- Have an ABN and have been trading for a minimum of 12 months (businesses who have been in operation for less than 12 months may be considered based on evidence of viability);
- Business can demonstrate loss of cashflow reduction of 30% or more (minimum 15% for Not-for-Profits) (compared between the same one week period between April 2019 and April 2020);
- Be able to demonstrate that they can or have 'pivoted' their good/s or service/s to adapt to current rules (e.g. sell online, start deliveries);
- · Have already, or are willing to be, connected with a Business Connect Advisor or industry specific business advisor (Council can assist businesses in connecting with an advisor. Please email business@liverpool.nsw.gov.au); and
- Have registered for the Federal Government's JobKeeper allowance and/or the small business COVID-19 support grant.
