SPECIAL UPDATE COVID19 RESTRICTIONS EASED

The NSW Government announced the <u>easing of some COVID-19 restrictions</u> from Friday 15 May. The following are now allowed:

- Cafes and restaurants can seat 10 patrons at any one time and continue to provide takeaway and delivery;
- Weddings of up to 10 guests;
- Indoor funerals up to 20 mourners and outdoor funerals up to 30; and
- Religious gatherings/places of worship up to 10 worshippers

A reminder that places open to the public must allow at least <u>4 square metres of space</u> for each person on the premises.

Please refer to the <u>NSW Health website</u> for information about COVID-19, business trading restrictions and details of what you can and can't do under current public health orders.

Council is pleased to advise its Customer Service Centre at 33 Moore St, Liverpool, has reopened to the public from $8.30 \, \text{am} - 4.30 \, \text{pm}$ weekdays. The area has been deep cleaned and a security guard is ensuring a maximum eight visitors are allowed to enter at any one time, through separate entry and exit points.

INVESTMENT IN THE GREAT SOUTH WEST

The NSW Government last week announced funding for Council to fast-track one if its <u>tactical urbanism projects</u>, for <u>Railway Serviceway</u>, to boost foot traffic and vibrancy in our recovering city centre.

In recent weeks Council has advocated to the NSW Government for funding of a list of 23 shovel-ready projects across the Liverpool LGA, valued at over \$120 million, to support the recovery of Liverpool's economy. The projects range from urban design and road upgrades to arts centre improvements and sustainability enhancements, providing job opportunities and community infrastructure to support the region's growth.

Council recently announced that Channel 9's The Voice Australia reality series has made Liverpool its new home for season nine. The move adds to the region's economic diversity and sets a precedent for other large-scale television and film productions to come to our great city in the future, demonstrating that we can play a longer-term role in supporting Australia's arts, culture, media and entertainment industry.
