Amendment to Liverpool Development Control Plan 2008 – Part 2.5 Middleton Grange



Liverpool City Council is exhibiting a draft amendment to the Liverpool Development Control Plan 2008 - Part 2.5 Middleton Grange. Feedback is invited on the proposed changes.

What is the Liverpool Development Control Plan?

Development within most of the Liverpool Local Government Area (LGA) is controlled by the Liverpool Development Control Plan 2008 (LDCP). The LDCP contains objectives and controls which are used to guide development and assess Development Applications. The LDCP contains controls relating to building design, landscaping, open space, road layout and parking.

What changes are proposed?

The amendment seeks to update Part 2.5 Middleton Grange with new objectives and controls for development within the future Middleton Grange Local Centre site.

The changes primarily include updates to the road layout, new controls for open space and activation of the local centre, strengthening of design requirements and correction of errors.

Why are changes proposed?

The Liverpool Local Environmental Plan 2008 (planning legislation) was amended in late 2022 to change certain controls (e.g., height of building, floor space ratio) to enable a future Local Centre at Middleton Grange.

The purpose of this amendment is to align the LDCP with these planning controls which apply to Middleton Grange.

Submissions from the public exhibition will be considered and reported to a Council meeting. If Council decides to proceed with the draft amendment, the revised LDCP will be finalised.

Planning approval (such as a Development Application) is still required prior to the development of the Local Centre.
